Changes to Year 8 School Based Immunisation Programme for 2017

- Due to recent changes to the National Immunisation Schedule, the School Based Immunisation Programme Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine will now be offered to boys as well girls in Year 8.

There will be two vaccinations given with a 6 month gap between the doses. Information on the vaccine and a consent form will be given to your child early in 2017 for you to fill out and return to the school. No child will be vaccinated without written consent.
