WRITING HEADS UP:

Next week Glenbrook School students will be sitting their writing assessment. Students may want to plan, practise or prepare. They may not bring the plan or notes into their writing assessment. If you would like your child to study or prepare for their writing assessment here are some things they need to consider when preparing:

Team Piwakawaka: Students will be writing a recount. The recount will be "A special time with family and friends".

Students are assessed well if their ideas are in order and can use first, then and next. Students need to show use of capital letters, full stops and a comma. A picture plan is used to support planning. Time connectives are used and students are beginning to add some details with adjectives. Writing is completed using a feeling statement or thought such as "I had the best time because...."

Team Tui: Students will be writing an explanation.

Students will need to explain how and why something happens. There must be a clear introduction, explanation sequence and conclusion. Students must show paragraphing, use compound sentences, commas, apostrophes, regular correct use of capital letters and full stops. It is important students write in the present tense. All students in Team Tui will have their idea for writing confirmed by the end of the week.

Team Kereru and Team Haast: Students will be writing a description about "A moment in time". Team Kereru will be writing about a school event. Team Haast will be writing about an aspect of Snow Camp.

All students must show in their description a snapshot of a moment and it must NOT be a recount. The writing should include an opening paragraph which identifies the time and place. The scene should be set using the senses as a guide. What does it taste, feel, smell, look or sound like? Use of similes, metaphors, adjectives etc in paragraphs are needed. The concluding statement includes a summary with a reflective statement. Sentence structure should be complex and accurate with complex punctuation such as ellipses, speech marks, parenthesis,

All students have been preparing for their assessment. Team Tui have examples and instructions in their shared slides. Teams Haast and Kereru have instructions, students work and other exemplars in google slides or google classroom.
