Students in years 0-4 have access to Sunshine readers online and all students have access to library. Please contact your child's teacher if your child has misplaced their username or password.

Te Reo Maori and Mandarin will continue to be taught this term with our language teachers on Wednesdays. Speeches are this term. Please check with your child what the Team requirements are and the timelines for these.

Exams begin next week starting with Digital Technologies for ICAS. years 7 and 8 will be sitting their exams on Monday due to Technology being on Tuesday. Years 3-6 will sit Digital Technologies on Tuesday.

We have a very busy term full of activities and professional learning being hosted in our school. Please keep an eye out for your alerts in the Parent Portal for events and notices.
