## Important Calf Club Announcement

With the announcement on Monday that the Government intends to carry on with the eradication of M.bovis, the Waiuku Combined Schools Calf Club Association has unanimously decided that calves will not be able to attend Group Day for 2018. The Association has strongly recommended that all Local School Calf Clubs do the same. Therefore, Glenbrook School will not be doing calves this year for Calf Club. However, we will still be doing lambs, chickens, goats, small furries, dogs, horses, garden and PTA options.

Just because you can't have a calf doesn't mean you have to miss out on Calf Club. Please consider rearing a lamb or goat as M.Bovis does not affect these animals. There will be more categories for lambs and goats this year so please don't let this disease spoil our Calf Club. More information regarding Glenbrook Calf Club will be available soon.

## Student Centered Leadership

On Thursday Glenbrook School is hosting fifty school leaders from around Franklin. We are developing our professional learning in Student Centered Leadership and this is being facilitated with the University of Auckland's Centre for Educational Leadership.

In the first phase of Student Centred Leadership our leaders will focus on understanding and building relational trust, establishing goals and expectations, solving complex problems and leading effective school inquiry. This is done within the ethos and culture of our schools with the aims of continuing to accelerate student outcomes. Please note that we finish at 2.30 and that car parks will be available after this time for school pick up.

## Sexuality in Education: Health Programme

On Thursday 14th June and Thursday 21st June we will be holding an information session with parents about the Sexuality in Education programme we will be teaching. This is a legislative requirement recommended by the Ministry of Education and we are required to teach this annually. It is a time for you, as parents, to ask questions and be informed about the programme we will be teaching in Term 3 2018. We urge any new families to come along to one of the sessions so you are clearly informed what the programme is and is not about. This programme is taught across the school in years 0 to year 8 every Monday 11.30 - 1.00 throughout Term 3. Students are able to play in the playground while parents attend the information session.

## What will our students learn in Sexuality in Education?

In the early years students will develop listening skills, talk about their feelings and relationships, and look at their roles within the family. They will learn about contributing to safe environments, addressing bullying and accommodating difference. Students will be able to name body parts, and identify differences between the genders.

From year 5 onwards they will learn about the physical and emotional development of puberty, reproduction and sexual behaviour. They will learn about relationships, keeping themselves sexually safe and decision-making skills within a scientific lens.

The programme will be taught every Monday throughout Term 3 by all teachers at the same time. It is a follow on programme, which we have taught over the last three years.
