## Parent Portal

It is essential that all parents and caregivers have access to our Parent Portal. If you have not done so, please email Miss Stuart your email so this can be set up. You then need to download the @schoolmobile app to your phone. You will be emailed the username and password for your child or children and you will need to enter this into your @schoolmobile app. This will give you access to notices, your child's assessment data, learning information, urgent notices, your child's attendance and school events. This will also notify you immediately if we were to have a school emergency or go into lockdown. **From Term 3, we will not be sending class newsletters home.** These will be accessed from the parent portal. We will also be phasing out the school newsletter by paper and sending it out weekly via the Parent Portal.

We note that many parents have signed up to the portal but have not downloaded the @schoolmobile app and signed into it. Please remember to do this to receive valuable information about Glenbrook School.



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## Mid-Year 2018 Data

With the removal of National Standards we are now reporting on NZ Curriculum levels. Last week you received your child's Mid-Year Report. It will have indicated which NZ curriculum level your child is working within. The evidence we use in determining which curriculum level your child works within includes assessments such as easttle, running records, JAMs, GLOSS, IKANs, achievement against our Writing and Reading progressions and various other assessments. The majority of evidence we use includes how your child actively participates and achieves in their learning within lessons. Have they achieved their lesson intentions each week and to which success criteria? We make decisions on how successful your child is and how consistent they are within those lessons. It is also important to note that we work across all curriculum strands and we expect our students to have a solid foundation in all strand areas. For example, in Mathematics, your child may be strong in number but may need to consolidate their measurement or statistic skills. The breadth of the curriculum is taken into account. We are very proud of our Mid-Year Data, it is where we expect our students to be, but this is only one piece of how we are Realising Potential. Our Values and Qualities of Learning are equally important and we look forward to continually accelerating learner practice.
