Message from the Principal

Kia Ora Parents and Whanau and welcome to week 1 of term 3. I hope you enjoyed some valuable time with your families. Thank you to our amazing staff who spent much of the break in school preparing classes, planning and reviewing the many educational documents and processes needed to continue to be an effective and successful school.

Purposeful Play

This term Glenbrook School begins Purposeful Play every Monday. In Piwakawaka this involves rotating play activities where students discover, explore, communicate and collaborate. In years 3-8 I will be leading Purposeful Play in the hall. This time is dedicated to our Qualities of Learning in an authentic social context. Students will have opportunities to play games and complete challenges with their peers. They will be encouraged to discuss with their peers, rules for games prior to starting and how the game works. If and when conflict arises, students will be assisted to use our WITS programme or seek a Peer Mediator or the supervising teacher. We want students to experience peer conflict so they can grow their perseverance and resilience skills. We want them to communicate, collaborate and think. We want them to practice their skills naturally and safely. We also want students to have more opportunities to develop friendships and work with their peers where fun and competition occur.

Many students do not have opportunities for regular play with peers due to where they live, the household timetable or a variety of reasons. Our students tell us what they want most of all from school is a friend. An analysis of our playground behaviour indicates that students need to practice what to do when conflict occurs naturally in peer situations. In Term 1 and 2 we worked hard to define bullying, define what a friend is and what to do when conflict occurs in the classroom or in the playground at Glenbrook School. Purposeful Play is the next step for students to play, negotiate, win, lose, laugh and have fun ready to use their WITS or seek help if conflict should occur. Each week students will also have opportunities to practice their Peer Mediation skills with their peers.

Welcome back Mrs Keown

We welcome back Mrs Keown from maternity leave this term. She will be working in Uenuku for the remainder of the year with Mrs Thornton, Mrs Kovati-Waru and Mrs Thompson. Mrs Keown and Mrs Thornton will share the

classroom role with Mrs Kovati-Waru. Mrs Thompson will begin her maternity leave on Monday 27th August.

You then need to download the @schoolmobile app to your phone. You will be emailed the username and password for your child or children and you will need to enter this into your @schoolmobile app. This will give you access to



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notices, your child's assessment data, learning information, urgent notices, your child's attendance and school events. This will also notify you immediately if we were to have a school emergency or go into lockdown. From Term 3, we will not be sending class newsletters home. These will be accessed from the parent portal. We will also be phasing out the school newsletter by paper and sending it out weekly via the Parent Portal.
