Writing Tips:

Piwakawaka:

Recount of something that has happened (piece of writing about an experience a child has had)

Include: Who, where, what, when, why and simple time connectives to join ideas (first, next, then, finally) - finish with a simple response (e.g. feelings statement: I loved it because ... / It was amazing because ...) Ways to help at home:

Discuss events, activities that have happened in the past. Discuss experiences you have had together as a family. Talk about the order that the event occurred in. Talk about how they felt during the experience.

Tui:

Tui Syndicate will be focusing on Recount Writing. The purpose of a recount writing is to recount an experience or to record an event. A recount begins with an orientation which includes details about when, who, what, where and why. It then uses a sequence of events which explains to the reader what happened first, next, after that and at the end. The recount ends with a personal comment which explains how the writer felt or thought about their experience. Students should be able

to use interesting vocabulary such as adjectives to make

their recount interesting for the reader. They also should

be using interesting language features such as similies,

metaphors, and onomatopoeia to describe their

experience in an interesting way.

Kereru:

Kereru Syndicate will be focusing on Explanation Writing. Explanation writing is a form of transactional writing that tells your audience how something works or why something happens. It is written in the present tense. An explanation begins with an introduction to the topic followed by a description of the parts of the topic. Each part of the topic is written in a new paragraph and backed up by supporting information, giving the "how" or "why" There is "when" details. also and information. The parts and paragraphs are in a logical order. The explanation ends with a summary that includes the main points and makes an interesting comment, a variety of sentence beginnings and lengths used explanation to make the interesting, Technical words related to the topic are also included.
