CALF CLUB - SATURDAY 29 SEPTEMBER 2018

Just over a week to go until Calf Club Day!

The judges are booked, the ribbons are ready, and the cups are polished! Time to put the finishing touches on your Posters, Diaries and Letterboxes, and make sure that your animals are ready for their big day. There's still a bit more growing time for those Magic Beanstalks!

Dates to remember:

All posters (Chicken, Horse, Dog, Small Furry) need to be at school next **Monday, 24 September** - please bring them to the Office. Make sure your name is on the back.

Magic Beanstalk Diaries - are **due Tuesday 25 September** - please bring them to the Hall and make sure they are clearly named. NB: This is just your Diary. Actual Magic Beanstalks to be brought in on Calf Club Day.

Letterboxes - are **due into school on Thursday 27 September** - please bring to the Hall. On Thursday 27 or Friday 28, participating students will be allocated a time to meet the Judges and discuss their letterbox.

Please note that posters, diaries and letterboxes must be brought into school on the due date or they may not be judged.

Baking: All families are asked to send in a plate of baking on **Friday 28 September**. Please send in baking on a paper or plastic plate that we do not need to return. All baking is to come to the staffroom. Each student or family will receive 5 Whanau points. Baking is then sold at the cake or lolly stall.

Grocery Items: Please continue to bring in grocery items for our large grocery raffles - tin cans, packets, bottles or other grocery items. There is a box in every classroom that items can be placed in. Each item earns a Whanau point. The class that brings the most items wins fish and chips for lunch! (Please note that the number of items are divided per student in the class for equity)

Heritage Exhibits: On **Friday 28 September**, all students will participate in making an item for the Heritage exhibitions. We encourage family and friends to join us in this fun day or creating. What you need to bring in will depend on the option you choose. Mrs Hobman will be visiting on Monday during Principal's assembly to show the students what they can do.

Children can choose **one** of the following two options:

Heritage Exhibit Option 1: Vegetable animal ~ To create this exhibit, you will need to use fruit and vegetables to inspire your animal creation. It can be a fun journey through the vegetable



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shop looking at the odd-shaped pieces and dreaming of what they could become! Consider your design at home but please leave the making to be done at school. Please bring your fruit and vegetables in a named container if you want to take the leftovers home, otherwise bring only what you need to complete the job. We will provide toothpicks, knives (for adult assistance), chopping boards and also a selection of seconds from the local fruit shops.

Heritage Exhibit Option 2: Aqua Jar ~ There is something very special about an underwater floral arrangement. If you select this option, you will need to bring a jar that seals well and a selection of flowers on stems which can fit inside it. The flowers will be blue tacked to the lid which will then be secured on your water-filled jar. We will provide water - coloured and clear, blue tack, glitter and also a sharing table with spare flowers for everyone to use. ***We encourage family and friends to join us in this fun day of creating on Friday 28th September.***

Calf Club DRESS UP: Students (and families!) are able to dress up in Rural Fancy Dress. They could dress up as a farm worker, a farm vehicle or a farm animal or even a hay bale, snail or flower. Be imaginative! All students that are in costume when they register will be awarded 5 Whanau points. Rosettes will be awarded for the top 3 juniors and top 3 seniors. Students will need to be at prize giving to win.

The Calf Club Programme and a page of 'Important Notices' will be sent home with children next week. Please look out for these in your child's bag. You will see in the Programme that some categories will be judged by Team this year, and other categories will be judged as Junior (children in Teams Parekereke & Tui) and Senior (Teams Kereru & Haast). If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask.

Class Items: All students have made three class items which will be on display on Calf Club day. Students and teachers have worked hard throughout the term to make and present these. Judging is done on Friday evenings so when the classes open you will see how some students placed. All students do a great job at preparing for Calf Club.

Calf Club Calendars: All students have completed a piece of art for a Calf Club calendar. These will be displayed on the whiteboard in every class on Calf Club. Order forms will be available if you wish to order a calendar or other available items. They make great gifts, especially for Christmas or family mementos.

Please note: For each category, ribbons and certificates will be awarded throughout the morning. Trophies and cups for overall winners, and fancy dress prizes will be presented at the prize-giving at 12.15pm. All students are expected to attend.

Other important information for the day:

- Parents are not allowed in the rings, or tents while judging is underway.
- Dogs are to be judged on the grass area in front of Parekereke. Please bring your dog on a leash and keep

them supervised at all times. All dogs must remain on the grassed area. No dogs are allowed near any animal, food or game area. Please bring a plastic bag and collect your dog's doo doos.

- Only dogs competing are to come to school on the day.
- Horse owners, please ensure that your horse comes with a bit.
- If possible, please lock or tie up animal cages as little fingers can sometimes undo them with disastrous results.
- There will be cash only for the stalls (no EFT-POS).

Calf Club is a very important day in the Glenbrook School calendar. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask. The focus of the day is our rural community, even without calves, goats and lambs!

Next week is the last week of term, so students will be in the Calf Club frenzy, they are also over tired and ready to have a break. I recommend early nights where you can, dinner and devices away. Have a restful weekend everyone (for those of you not completing letterboxes, posters or last minute Calf Club ideas). Let's have a great build up and an even greater Calf Club day!
